Praying for the
Canadian Military Community



Preamble: Below are themes relevant to the ministry of the Military Christian Fellowship of Canada. We desire that you refer to these themes throughout February, time and time again, and pray for the community that God has invited you to bless. Consider taking the sample scripture in each subsection and turning them into your prayer.

PRAY FOR OUR NATION AND ITS LEADERS

“God keep our land, glorious and free. “For many of us, freedom has become synonymous with personal independence, the ability to make our own decisions and choose our path in life, to do whatever we want, whenever we want. But this is not the freedom that Jesus promised us. When Jesus revealed himself as the Messiah, He said that He had come to Earth to “proclaim freedom” (Luke 4:18). And on another occasion, He said, “If the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed” (John 8:36). We must pray for our leaders, asking God to aid them in making wise choices. Still, we must also ask for The Holy Spirit’s intervention so they can be freed from the bondage of sin that grips and often directs their lives.

Consider praying this: *“Father, at one time, many in our nation believed You were the reason for our blessings and that You ruled over this land. We know that is not the case today, and we ask that Your grace and mercy draw our citizens to You. Bless our leadership with the wisdom to lead with justice and mercy.*

PRAY FOR OUR MILITARY LEADERS

We are blessed with strong, dedicated, and loyal military leaders. Some have failed morally because they are human, but that does not define our leadership corp. They serve selflessly, and we should be grateful for this. They need our prayers to help battle the conflicting messages of the world.

Consider praying this: *“Father, many of our military leaders do not know You as the loving God who wants what is good for them and the rest of us. Evil has permeated our societies and us; we need these warriors to protect and defend the innocent. Father, can You invite them to know You. Jesus, will You keep knocking on their lives until they answer. Holy Spirit, will You soften their hearts to hear. Amen”.*

PRAY FOR THOSE ON OPERATIONS

Today, around the world, men and women are serving our nation. They do this at the expense of their comfort and time with their family and friends. We should remember them in our prayers and continually ask for God’s blessing.

Consider praying this: *“Heavenly Father, it is unfortunate that we need the military to help preserve our peace and freedoms. Since our beginning as a nation, people have chosen to leave family behind in the fight against Evil. Lord, we want them to know You as saviour and ask that You protect them from harm while inviting them to the absolute peace and freedom you offer. Amen.”*

PRAY FOR OUR CHAPLAINS

Before Jesus ascended to the Father, He instructed His disciples to take His truths and gospel to all lands. We are fortunate that while our military serves at home or on foreign soil, men and women have accepted the call as chaplains to follow them and bring the gospel with them.

Consider praying this: *“Heavenly Father, bless and protect our Military Chaplains. Fill them with Your hope and truths so they can be the light that our military sorely needs. Protect them from the evil ones who want to steal and destroy their message of your love. Amen”*

PRAY FOR OUR SERVING MILITARY

At one time, the military motto was “there is no life like it.” That thought is still true today, as military life is unique. But since those days, the world has become more angry, aggressive, and evil. Injustice, greed, and cruelty are everywhere. Our military men and women find themselves in situations that often conflict with their morals, which can play havoc with their minds and souls.

Consider praying this: *“Heavenly Father, our military needs Your protection from the evil one who takes many forms aimed at destroying their courage and hope. Many serve away from the comfort of their family and can feel alone. Will You fill them with ease and let them know the God of the universe cares for them. Will You invite them to hear and understand the words of truth Your son Jesus has shared with the world? Amen.”*

PRAY FOR MILITARY FAMILIES

We were not created to live in isolation from others. God designed the family to bring love and companionship to each other. Military life often causes separation and tears at that unity, and cracks in a relationship can appear during stressful times.

Consider praying this: *“Lord, may Your love encircle our military families as they endure the separation and hardships that can come with service life. May Your hope go before them, carrying them through the difficulties and stresses they face. May Your wisdom be beside them as they live and work in this unique lifestyle. Lord, keep them safe under the shadow of Your Almighty wings. Amen”*

DND EMPLOYEES

Since the early 60s, the military has had a good relationship with civilian co-workers. The relationship may have been strained a couple of times. But through mutual respect and inclusiveness, a team has been built.

Consider praying this: *“Heavenly Father, as our civilian workforce enters their workplace, we ask that You accompany them and allow them to sense Your presence. May they become aware of Your comforting proximity. Amen”*

RETIRED MILITARY

The reality of our relationship with God is summed up in these words:” If you are not dead, you are not done.” Often when our military leaves the Forces, they feel alone and undervalued. The camaraderie, challenges and even difficult time have defined their life while they served. When they retire, this identity slips away as their sense of worth.

Consider reflecting on and praying this scripture: *“Even to your old age and gray hairs, I am he, I am he who will sustain you. I have made you, and I will carry you; I will sustain you, and I will rescue you”. Isaiah 46:4-5*

PRAY FOR OUR MILITARY WHO, FOR WHATEVER REASON OR CIRCUMSTANCE, HAVE FOUND THEMSELVES HOMELESS

It is difficult to imagine that our peers with whom we shared life are homeless. It is hard to imagine that mental health issues have stolen the life of many of these dedicated, loyal men and women. We can pray for them, and we must, but we should also find a way to support the agencies that focus on helping our broken veterans.

Consider praying this: *“Father, it was not Your plan that mental health issues would ravage Your creation or homelessness would exist in this rich world. Would You please help us become compassionate for those in horrible situations? Would You please speak to us about ways to help with our resources and time? Protect those men and women on the street until we can bring hope, a home, and companionship back to them. Amen”*

PRAY FOR THE MILITARY CHRISTIAN FELLOWSHIP OF CANADA

The MCF recognizes that they have been invited to participate in God’s mission to take the Word to the world. They have been specifically assigned to reach out to the military community, both serving and retired and their families. Your prayers and notes of encouragement corroborate the mission, and we are grateful for the power of Jesus and the love of His children. Insider praying this scripture: *“Father, thank You for preparing the mission field unique to our lives and experiences.
